Write your name and phone number on each ticket you receive and then circle the category of the book basket you'd like to win. The categories are:

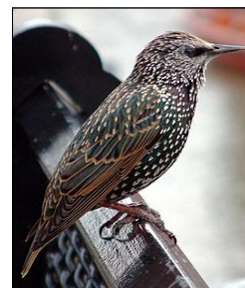
Mystery, Fantasy, Bonnets, Steamy, Western, and DIY.

Poetry of the Month

Mozart's Elegy to his Starling

For about three years the composer Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart kept a pet starling. The first record of the starling is the entry Mozart made in his expense book when he bought it on 27 May, 1784. The music Mozart jotted down in the book is fairly close to the



opening bars of the third movement of his Piano Concerto No. 17 in G, K. 453, which Mozart had completed a few weeks earlier (12 April). Presumably Mozart taught the bird to sing this tune in the pet store, or wherever it was that he bought it. The bird lived as a pet in his household for three years and died on 4 June 1787. Mozart buried the creature in the garden with (as contemporary biographers observed) considerable ceremony. Mozart's funeral poem is translated by Robert Spaethling into

vernacular English as follows.
