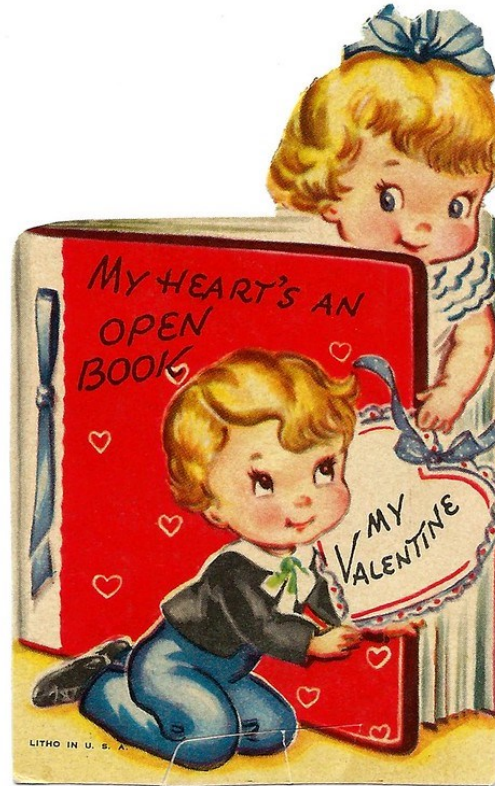

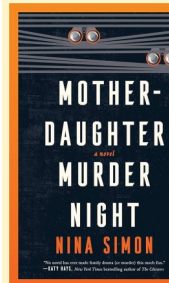
Potluck, 6:15; Program, 7:00
