Home Composting

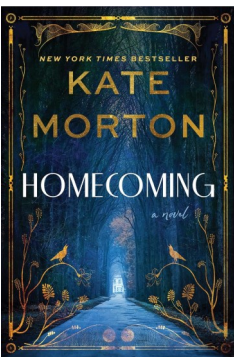
Tuesday, May 7th, 6:30
